BREAD UPON THE WATERS

On Friday and Saturday, November 20 and 21, this Society held a very successful rummage sale at the New Port Richey Recreation Center. The net revenue amounted to \$585.00. This feat was achieved through the combined effort and dedication of many loyal officers, members, and friends and the wonderful cooperation and assistance of the New Port Richey Recreation Department.

At the conclusion of the sale many items remained unsold. Under the aegis of the New Port Richey Fire Department, this material was released to the local Goodwill Industries Center. The Fire Department will refer the unfortunate victims of disaster and adverse circumstances to the Goodwill for donations from this stockpile. The Richey Suncoast Theatre group and several charitable and civic related agencies also benefit from our sales. Thus our Society has engaged in philanthropic work in the community that many of us were unaware of. Many items given to the Society are placed with groups where they will do the most good--Disabled American Veterans Chapter 78, Richey Elementary School (Smithsonian magazines). Another rummage sale is contemplated in April 1988.

Credit is due many for the success of these ventures and particularly Gene Sniffen who seems to be a veritable fountain of energy, planning, and untiring industry.

A bake sale was held at the museum in conjunction with the Celebration of the Arts in Sims Park on Saturday and Sunday, November 21 and 22. This project netted \$154.00. Again our thanks to those who baked cakes and cookies and assured the success of this endeavor. Our special thanks to Ceil Zubrod for championing the bake sale.

GREEN CHRISTMAS IN WEST PASCO

"The first public Christmas Tree in Sims Park was placed in front of the Civic Clubhouse in Sims Park in 1916 by the women of the Civic Club. This was to become a yearly tradition. A press release of 1935 notes that a lovely tree, complete with electric lights, was placed at the edge of Orange Lake. In later years, it was to become an annual feature for the tree to be placed in the center of the lake on a float with its lights reflecting into the water. Strings of colored lights were also strung around the lake.

"A display of large, framed paintings of Christmas scenes painted by an early settler, Mr. Charles De Boer, were also set up around the lake, making the holiday season in this area especially beautiful.
