

HIBISCUS MEMORY GARDEN

Seven years ago in 1985, Frances, who was a member of the Historical Society as well as a member of the Hibiscus Society, had the thought that it might be nice to combine the two. The Historical Society had the space and the Hibiscus Society had no permanent location.

Both societies were mutually agreeable and the Hibiscus Memory Garden was started. A Memory Book was started and kept in the Museum on display and people were asked to donate \$5 for the purchase of a hibiscus plant to be planted on the Museum grounds. Many varieties were used but mainly the garden variety which will come back if there is a frost in wintertime. At present there are seventy-eight plants growing and there are several requests from others who wish to remember their loved ones in this manner. But at this time of year, Frances will not plant again until Spring (March).

THE BUILDING: Seven Springs School House, built in 1913. Children had to bring their own desks to school; two examples are shown at the Museum. The Friarson family moved into the schoolhouse and used it as their home in 1925. In 1980 it was moved to Sims Park and dedicated in January of 1983. The addition of new library space is being added in 1992. Handicapped ramp available.

The founding of the Historical Society began in January, 1973. The Museum will celebrate its 10th Anniversary in 1993 with an Open House.

LIBRARY: While it does stock novels, biographies, etc., it is also used by historians checking details of early settlers, interesting facts concerning the city, and general research concerning Florida and local families.

PERMANENT COLLECTION: Quilts, Wedgewood and other fine china, glassware, antique items used in the home many years ago, art and other items from around the world. Other collections changed frequently.

NEW - THE MEETING ROOM is being changed to Indian artifacts, paintings, Indian arrowheads, pottery and blankets.
