

Congress Looks Ahead

A new source of power, which burn[s] a distillate of kerosen called gasoline ... has been pro duced by a Boston enginee [George Brayton]... This discov ery begins a new era in the histor of civilization; it may someda prove to be more revolutionary i the development of human societ than the invention of the wheel, th use of metals or the steam engine Never in history has society bee confronted with a power so full of potential danger and at the sam time so full of promise for the futur of man and for the peace of th world....

We therefore earnestly recommend that Congress setup the Horse less Carriage Commission which will have a complete control over a sources of gasoline and similar explosive elements in all activities connected with their development and use in the United States. These measures may seem drastic and far-reaching, but the discovery in which we are dealing involves forces of nature too dangerous to finite any of our usual concepts.
