GLENN H. DILL, LONG TIME HISTORICAL SOCIETY MEMBER, DIES

GLENN DILL, local historian and one time radio announcer/ disc jockey/personality and newspaper columnist, died December 5 at age 83. he was a Charter member of the West Pasco Historical Society.

He also wrote more than 1,000 columns for the <u>Suncoast News</u> and the <u>New Port Richey Chronicle</u>, many of which were used in his book, <u>Suncoast Past.</u> The book can be found in all Pasco County libraries. He was also an environmentalist and conservationist. Some of his more than 250 awards can be found in the Glenn Dill Reading Room at Pasco-Hernando Community College.

EARLY DAYS IN NEW PORT RICHEY

From the files of Jullie Obenreder

Dr. Elroy W. Avery was the first Mayor of New Port Richey and the founder of the New Port Richey Library. He celebrated his 91st birthday on July 14, 1935 at his home on the Boulevard North. Due to failing health only a few intimate friends visited him to celebrate the day but he received many cards and letters.

Dr. Avery not only began the city library but practically supported it during the lean years. He said he greatly appreciated the honor of having the library named "The Avery Public Library."

The Avery Public Library was incorporated in 1919 with the Board accepting a 50 X 150 foot lot donated by Dr. and Mrs. Avery as being the most desirable site for a proposed new library building. A bond issue to build at this location was placed on the ballot but was soundly defeated by the voters - 163 to 39. This was a disappointment to Dr. Avery but he continued his work with the library. (The site he chose is now the site of the West Pasco Historical Society Museum.)

The name was later changed to the New Port Richey Library by a vote of City Council. No reason was ever given for this change BUT it was another disappointment to Dr. Avery. This act of the City Council deleted his name from the building which housed the many books he had donated making a nucleus for today's library.

Dr. Avery passed away December 1, 1935 after a long illness A room in our new city library has been designated "The Avery Room" which contains many volumes written by him. It is appropriate that we should remember and honor this generous, scholarly man.

Thanks again for helping make our little gift shop a success in 1993! Donations of merchandise are needed for 1994.


WE ARE SORRY TO HEAR
