# FROM THE FILES OF JULIE OBENREDER

The headline in the New Port Richey Post, (a forerunner of the New Port Richey Press), January 4th, 1916, stated "New Port Richey Leads in its first year!!!" The article goes on to say, "New Port Richey is Booming!!! Developement has set in all sides."

Following is partial list of what happened in less than a year.

A rock road was constructed by the county, at a cost of \$135,000. connecting New Port Richey with Tarpon Springs, Tampa, St. Petersburg and other points in Pinellas County.

A new iron bridge was constructed by the county over the Cotee River.

The Tampa and Gulf Railway inaugurated daily train service between New Port Richey, Tarpon Springs, St. Petersburg and points south.

A post office was established and every month showed phenominal increases.

A local and long distance telephone service was installed.

A new school was constructed at a cost of \$2,500.00.

A community club was organized with fifty members. Material was ordered for a clubhouse to be built in Enchantment park.

A new church was built at a cost of \$3,000.

A Board of Trade was organized in 1916 by George R. Sims with meetings held weekly to discuss projects for the advancement of the town.

Local residents are hardly pioneers with great visions, and are beginning to see their dreams come true.

Mayor Peter Altman is expected to proclaim the month of November as Finnish American month in New Port Richey during the November 1st Port Richey Council Meeting.

The West Pasco Historical Society, in conjunction with the Finnish American Club, will be featuring displays all during the month of November such as educational types of documentation, antiques, wall hangings, wood sculptures, Finnish artifacts and apparel.

Lectures and entertainment will be presented on both Sunday, November 13th at 2:30 P.M. and Thursday evening at 7:00 p.m. on November 17th in our Museum. The lectures will include the "History of Finnish American Club in New Port Richey" by Irene Kallio; "A Brief History of Finland" by Darlene Ballard, president of the Finnish American Club, and "Finland Today" by Christine Pertillo. The first settlers arrived in New Port Richey at the turn of the century. The organization date when the Finnish American Club of New Port Richey received its Charter was 1950. The new Clubhouse was built at 409 East Delaware Avenue with dedication ceremonies on June 6, 1951.
