Tribute to Dorothy and Alex Acey Thank You

Alex and Dorothy Acey arrived in Pasco County in 1969 from Detroit, where they owned a men's custom tailoring shop for 40 years. They co-owned a men's haberdashery shop located in Southgate Shopping Center with Eddie Lees until their retirement.

In 1981, they bought a lot in Seven Springs which contained a frame building in disrepair. They later learned that the structure was Pasco's first schoolhouse, built in 1913. After learning of the buildings historical significance, they donated it to the West Pasco Historical Society. In recognition and appreciation of their generosity, they were awarded a lifetime membership in the Society. This experience soon drew them into active participation. Alex was quoted as having said, "In the beginning I knew nothing about history now I can't get enough!" He served as the Society's president for six terms. He also served as a co-chairman of the Pasco County Centennial Committee in 1986. For this work, he was nominated by Pasco-Hernando College, for the title of King Pithla in 1987. He was also a civic activist and involved in numerous organizations. In his last year of office, he set a precedent when he stood atop the Oelsner Indian Mound and protested its possible destruction. The mound was later given to the people of Pasco County.

Alex and Dorothy were a team and gave unselfishly of their time and talents. They will be forever etched in our memories, everytime we switch on the copy machine, or walk into the building that was in disrepair, we can be thankful for their generous contribution to further enhance the growth of our Society/Museum/Library. They will always remain with us in spirit.

Their most recent and generous bequest is appreciated beyond words. It will be used to promote our purpose of preserving and furthering the knowledge of the history and prehistory of the State of Florida, West Pasco and nearby areas.

Their memory will always be revered and passed along to future generations by a grateful and dedicated Society.

Gazebo History by Julie Obenreder

The gazebo was built in 1924 and was paid for by the City of New Port Richey. It was located beyond the old Civic Club near the river in Sims Park. It has been moved 4 times since then, 3 times along the river front and then to its present location next to the museum. The West Pasco Historical Society made necessary repairs and former Vice President, Ken Carter, was instrumental in getting the Rotary Club's help in repainting it.

On August 24, 1995, the Society was given the responsibility of overseeing the operation of the gazebo. All requests for its use may now be referred to the West Pasco Historical Society. Many individuals and groups have shown an interest in using the gazebo for events and special occasions such as weddings. Pasco County Historical Preservation Committee

On Thursday evening, September 7, the meeting was called to order and chaired by Co-Chairman William Maytum, who lives in New Port Richey.

Scott Black, also a Co-Chairman, spoke to us concerning the two houses which have been passed by the State for the Historical Register; the Anderson house in New Port Richey, which serves as the Pasco Fine Arts Council located off Moog Road in Centennial Park and the Jeffries house in Zephyrhills.

Eddie Herman, from Dade City, spoke about the property named Stagecoach Village in which there supposedly is a 26 mile house, meaning 26 miles from Brooksville and 26 miles from Pleasant Plains (now called Land O' Lakes). In other words, a half-way house or marker, the Preservation hopes to locate.

Also a dedication plaque was presented to the German Prisoner of War Camp in Dade City on October 1st at 2 p.m.

The Historical Preservation Committee meetings are open to the general public but only board members may vote on proposed issues. The committee has been asked to decorate the Old Dade City Courthouse for Christmas.
