#### Marjorie Sims by Julie Obenreder

Since this is Women's History Month, I am reminded of the woman who was the first woman of prominence on our city. She was Marjorie Sims, wife of our city founder, George R. Sims.

She was a woman of high fashion, always immaculately dressed. On the hottest of summer days she would walk to town with white gloves, silk hose, high heeled slippers and carrying a parasol.

She was the first Chasco Fiesta Queen in 1922. She led the parade in an open car decorated with fresh flowers.

The Sims' home was located just north west of the area now known as Sims Park. Sims donated several acres of land to the city to be used as a park.

In 1916, Marjorie prevailed upon her husband to build the Civic Club on the river front at the north end of the park. It was used as a town hall to conduct city business, church services on Sunday and all other social functions.

The Woman's Club had charge of it until the club disbanded and the city took over the building. When City Council decided it was too expensive to maintain it was razed by a vote of Council members.

The West Pasco Historical Society held their meetings there and other functions such as their annual Christmas Party from 1973 until 1981. The Woman's Club charged fifteen dollars a night for its use. It was very convenient as it had an ample supply of table, chairs and well equipped kitchen.

Discussion was held on sites or structures that have been previously mentioned to have marker of plaques. The committee decide to place plaques at the Mount Zion AME Church; and at the following cemeteries if a structure to support a plaque can be built: Loyce, Vereen, and Greenfield. A marker will be placed at the Dade City Cemetery.

Burbridge mentioned that the County needs to know if the sites listed in the historical book require flagging for building permit conditions. She asked the members to review the book and report back next month. Also, she will send a county map to Eaton so he can mark the locations of the old sawmill sites.

Members broke up into groups on reviewing the historical resources listed in the historical book for corrections of supplements. Maytum suggested that he planned to have on public hearing on structures and sites that need to be added to the County's register.


# Do You Have a Historical Home By Belva Green
